## 2007 Registration Instructions & Notes

1. Please complete one form for each person attending. This helps us build an accurate mailing list and more easily track the number attending. They can be mailed together with one check for payment.
2. We want to encourage scouts to attend with their unit. For that reason, we have set a lower registration fee for youth with a unit, and also will further help our troops by giving one adult registration free for every eight scouts pre-registered by the August 13<sup>th</sup> early registration deadline. If unit leaders can't complete a form for each scout when submitting a registration, we just ask that you do one when checking in or bring it with you – again it helps build a record of who all we have on the camp!
3. We will of course take pre-registrations after August 13<sup>th</sup>, but the slight increase in cost is to help our cooks who start trying to purchase supplies for the anticipated number at that point. We will always take on-site registrations but so that we can ensure we have plenty of food and order enough commemorative patches, our costs obviously go up. PLEASE pre-register if at all possible.
4. As we have indicated, sleeping space in the buildings is tight. We try to save the Health Lodge and Trading Post for older members and for some of the staff. The admin building is the Bush family home and reserved for them obviously! We're more than happy to let anyone (as many as can fit anyway) who wished to toss a sleeping bag on the floor of the buildings or in some cases a cot if you bring it. Some of the younger gang even sleep in one end of the Dining Hall! But we strongly encourage that if you can plan on camping that you do so. We have four camper pads at the Family camp and will also setup wall tents (yes, just like the old days) in the Family Camp.
5. All meals are cooked and served in the Dining Hall. If you have a special dietary issue we should be aware of, please indicate it on the back of your individual registration form so we can make the cooks aware.
6. Keep in mind that while we follow scouting principles and youth protection policies, that our Homecoming is not a scout council sponsored event. Unit leaders (and parents) are responsible for their youth. For example, there are no life guards on duty at the lake – use at your own risk and under your adult supervision.
7. We are planning to have a “silent auction” after lunch for anyone wishing to do so for any items related to Eastern Arkansas Council, our camps or district events. How it will work is sellers will be asked for a \$5.00 donation (to go toward camperships to scout camp in Quapaw Area Council). Once the auction starts it will run for about 2 hours with individuals indicating their bids on a sheet with each item out for display. When the auction ends, we will total up everything, get payment from the buyers and return unsold items with money bid to the sellers. Other than the \$5.00 registration fee (for sellers only), the cost is only what you bid! Several folks have asked about doing this so we thought we'd give it a try this year. More details on how we're going to do this will be posted on the website in coming weeks. So start digging out that old stuff and get ready for an auction frenzy in the Dining Hall on Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup>!
8. We need two groups Saturday morning who would like to work on a couple of service projects we started in 2006. First, we want to work on the OA Brotherhood circle to rebuild the fence, set the totem and repair the fire lay. We need a couple of chain saws (adult operators), a power posthole auger and other heavy hand tools. We also need 3-4 folks to continue working to reorganize and setup the space in our museum to being displaying items again. Hopefully we will have enough help that we can spend 2-3 hours putting a little service time into helping the Bush family to improve and maintain what they have so kindly made available for us all to enjoy!
9. For those that pre-register, there will be a surprise drawing for something you will definitely want. There will be multiple winners. We won't say what it is, but it isn't just a free desert, attendance fee refund or some gag gift. There will be at least ten. And once you see what it is, you WILL want it because it is truly special.
