The unit leader must list all names in the group on the back of their registration form so we can associate group members.

## 2010 Registration Instructions & Notes

1. Please complete one form for each person attending. This helps us build an accurate mailing list and more easily track the number attending. They can be mailed together with one check for payment.
2. We want to encourage scouts to attend with their unit. For that reason, we have set a lower registration fee for youth with a unit, and also will further help our troops by giving one adult registration free for every eight scouts pre-registered by the **August 6<sup>th</sup>** early registration deadline. If unit leaders can't complete a form for each scout when submitting a registration, we just ask that you do one when checking in or bring it with you – again it helps build a record of who we have on the camp!
3. We will of course take pre-registrations after August 6<sup>th</sup>, but the slight increase in cost is to help our cooks who start trying to purchase supplies for the anticipated number at that point. We will always take on-site registrations but so that we can ensure we have plenty of food and order enough commemorative patches, our costs obviously go up. PLEASE pre-register if at all possible.
4. As we have indicated, sleeping space in the buildings is tight. We try to save the Health Lodge and Trading Post for older members and for some of the staff. The admin building is the Bush family home and reserved for them obviously! We're more than happy to let anyone (as many as can fit anyway) who wished to toss a sleeping bag on the floor of the buildings or in some cases a cot if you bring it. Some of the younger gang can even sleep in one end of the Dining Hall! But we strongly encourage that if you can plan on camping that you do so. You can bring your own tent or ask for one in family camp. We also have four camper pads at the Family camp area. The camper pads are reserved on a first-come, first-served basis through the registration form.
5. All meals are cooked and served in the Dining Hall. If you have a special dietary issue we should be aware of, please indicate it on the back of your individual registration form so we can notify the cooks.
6. Keep in mind that while we follow scouting principles and youth protection policies, that our Homecoming is not a scout council sponsored event. Unit leaders (and parents) are responsible for their youth. For example, there are no life guards on duty at the lake – use at your own risk and under your unit adult supervision.
7. We will again *tentatively* plan to have a “silent auction” either after lunch or supper. Once the auction starts it would run for about an hour with individuals indicating their bids on a sheet with each item out for display. When the auction ends, we will total up everything, get payment from the buyers and return unsold items with money bid to the sellers. There is no fee to buy or sell. Some sellers donate items just to sell to raise funds to provide Scout camperships for summer camp. If you have items you'd be interested in donating, contact Stephen White. Items should be related to Eastern Arkansas Area Council and it's camps or Quapaw Area Council. There may also be some items offered as “set price” or as a patch barrel for one fee.
